DRESS REGULATIONS

BOYS' DIVISION

- SHIRT:** Plain; white or pale blue, with tidy, stiff collar.
(For Summer Term only, short-sleeved shirts may be worn)
Shirts must be tucked into trousers at all times.
- TIE:** A House tie or Divisional tie, knotted close to the collar, which must be fastened, and worn outside the shirt. In the Boys' Division, Junior Division ties may not be worn. Divisional Colours may be worn.
- PULLOVER:** Years 7/8 plain grey with blue V- stripe or slipover
Years 9/11 plain navy V – neck or slipover
- TROUSERS:** Dark charcoal grey, plain and of sensible style. Denims, cords or cotton trousers may not be worn.
- BLAZER:** YEARS 7 - 9: Royal Blue Boys' blazer.
YEARS 10 - 11: Navy Blue Boys' blazer.
- SOCKS:** Plain and dark.
- SHOES:** Black **polished** shoes, plain style. Trainers, suede shoes, boots and shoes with coloured stitching are not permitted.
- SCARF:** School scarf or any plain dark navy or plain black scarf.
- COAT:** **Plain, dark coat**, anorak style to cover a Blazer (as available from the School Shop or in similar style) with no badges, insignias or significant decoration. Track suit tops and “hoodies” are not acceptable.

All these items (except shoes) may be purchased at the School Shop.

N.B. School Rules lay down that all articles of clothing, Gym Kit etc. must be clearly marked with the owner's name.

PLEASE ENSURE THAT ALL ARTICLES ARE CLEARLY NAMED

The school operates a lost property service and makes every effort to re-unite pupils with the majority of their lost belongings.

Please note that the School can not accept liability for loss of, or damage to, pupils' personal property including sports clothing and equipment whilst it is on or left at any of the School's premises. Such items should be clearly labelled with the pupil's name and, if necessary, high risk items should be covered on parent's household insurance policy separately. Such items should never be left overnight at School.

APPEARANCE

A high standard of personal appearance is expected at all times and anyone arriving in non-uniform clothing may expect to be sent home to change into regulatory items.

School uniform must be worn when at School matches and may be required at the discretion of a teacher on other occasions.

It is hoped that all boys will endeavour to take a pride in their appearance, especially with regard to hair which must be kept neat and tidy for example, off the face and collar and no shorter than a number 4 clipper setting. Extreme or unusual colourings are unacceptable. Dyed or bleached hair or bizarre styles are unacceptable. Jewellery (e.g. rings and earrings) must not be worn.

Mouthguards are compulsory for contact sports as is other 'safety' equipment.

DRESS FOR PHYSICAL EDUCATION AND GAMES

1. **PHYSICAL EDUCATION**

For all timetabled PE lessons the correct dress for all years is normally as follows:-

Navy blue shorts with King's logo with clean training shoes (not black soles).

A navy blue PE polo shirt with King's Logo.

White socks or School rugby socks.

Basketball boots which are loose fitting and trainers which are unlaced or loosely laced are considered hazardous and are not permissible.

Indoor extra curricular activities should generally comply with the above or dress should be kit specifically appropriate to the activity. No person will be permitted to take part in any activity unless appropriately dressed.

Rain jacket/Track suits will be permitted on occasions. These should be school issue only and should be worn over regulation kit and **NOT** as an alternative.

2. GAMES

For all timetabled games the dress for the Boys' Division is as follows:-

Winter

Rugby/Hockey Navy blue with King's Logo shorts; Royal blue reversible jersey with King's Logo (Rugby); Navy blue PE Shirt (Hockey) with King's Logo ; all royal blue socks embroidered with KSM logo; boots .

Cross Country etc (*kite marked studs are essential*); blue and blue/white School pattern reversible jersey. Training shoes are **NOT** considered adequate for games lessons on grass. School Tracksuits may be worn – over regulation kit.

Clean training shoes must be worn for all activities on the all-weather pitches or indoors.

Summer

Cricket Training shoes or cricket boots as preferred; either white cricket trousers or approved track suit bottoms; white cricket shirt ; white cricket sweater optional. School waterproof clothing/tracksuit can also be worn for practice depending on weather. (Cricket kit with King's logo can be bought from Mr Steve Moores i/c Cricket).

NOTE: Boys are not permitted to wear the same shirt for cricket and everyday wear

All other outdoor Summer Sports

Training shoes (or spikes for athletics) as preferred; blue/white reversible School pattern rugby jersey or Navy blue, school crested Polo shirt; navy blue shorts. When appropriate navy blue track suits may also be worn over regulation kit.

For Tennis only the approved white tennis shirt or blue PE polo may be worn.

Mouthguards are compulsory for contact sports as is other appropriate 'safety equipment' (box and helmet for cricket, shinpads for hockey etc). It is the pupil's responsibility to wear safety equipment.

NOTE

All games and PE kit should be clearly marked with the owner's name. A check will be made at the beginning of each year in Games and PE and at random times throughout the year.

The PE Department will *NOT* normally loan kit to those who forget their own except in very special circumstances.

A towel may be needed for showering after PE/Games etc.

The Principal will be pleased to clarify any points or difficulty with regard to dress and appearance.
